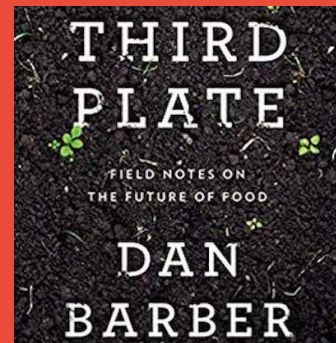

In an effort to continue our conversation about race and the belief that social change happens at the community level we are pleased to continue our series of discussions about race in America.

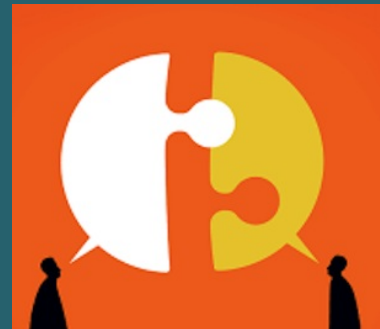
